question regarding the relationship between Sanskrit and Hebrew can be established by looking into the relationship which existed between two ancient civilizations, Indus and Babylonian. There are enough archeological evidences to prove such a relationship. For example, C.J. Gadd and Sydney Smith make an important observation about such an ancient relationship when they say:

The most important objects in this respect are the seals from Harappa, which appear to be exactly similar in shape to square stamp seals which are commonly found at and on Babylonian sites of the early period. ... These close resemblances of the Harappa seals to the products of Babylonian civilization cannot be accidental. The people who made these seals must have been in very close contact with Sumerian civilization, and have borrowed their artistic style and the basis of their writing from the Sumerians.⁵

A number of other authorities also agree with the above view.⁶ From other sources we also know that the written form of Sanskrit (its first ancient document is the *Rigveda*) was composed between 1500-2000 BC.⁷ And of course, today's Sanskrit which falls under the 'classic' category, belongs to a much later period. Around the same period Hebrew and other Semitic writings also developed.⁸ Now as the discussion on establishing the linguistic relationship of Hebrew and Sanskrit does not fall directly within the scope of this work, but if we accept the above observations, both historical and linguistic, for our purpose, then one point which becomes clear is that the Hebrew root *dall* and Sanskrit root *dal*, which resemble both in sense (idea) and sound through the Akkadian relationship with *dalulu*, have their roots prior to both present classical Sanskrit and Hebrew. There is a real possibility of 'Dalit' or *daluth* belonging either to the language used by people of the Babylonian or the people of the Indus civilization.

1.2. HEBREW USE OF THE TERM 'DALIT'

As mentioned earlier, the biblical root of the word 'Dalit' is *dall*. The word *dall* is a verb and it means to hang down, to be languid, be awoken, be low, be feeble. It has been used in the Old Testament Hebrew in its various forms.⁹ Examples are: in perfect form *dalote*, it has been used in Psalms 116:6, 142:7 and others and an imperfect
